


In order to create a world where every child, adolescent and young person is safe, protected and thriving, we must first know the facts

In Kenya, both girls and boys experience unacceptably high rates of sexual and physical violence



For many girls, the first experience of sexual intercourse is physically forced or coerced

Among those who had sexual intercourse before age 18

Girls face particularly high risks of sexual violence, often with devastating consequences

Percentage of females who have ever thought of suicide



Sexual violence often occurs in familiar locations

Location of first incident of sexual violence experienced by females prior to age 18

Girls and boys who experience sexual violence are not getting the support and services they need Females and males who told someone, sought services, and received services, among those who experienced sexual violence prior to age 18 41% TOLD SOMEONE 277% *Unreliable estimate.
